Changes to English proficiency requirements for 2016

The required individual scores in the TOEFL iBT have changed recently.

Internships

Students applying to the University of Sydney through the Study Abroad Program can request to be considered for a Study Abroad Internship. Through this program students will complete 120 hours with an industry or research placement and receive 6 credit points towards their enrolment. During the online application process the student will be asked indicate their interest by checking the Internships box and uploading a resume (CV) and cover letter.

The Study Abroad Internship Program is available primarily to students admitted through the Study Abroad Program. There may be limited internship placements open to Exchange students dependent upon a match between the placements available and the student's skills and interests. Exchange students should submit a resume (CV) and cover letter directly tostudy.abroadinternships@sydney.edu.au

Compulsory Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)

Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) is a compulsory health cover policy required by the Australian immigration department for all students on a student visa. This is compulsory regardless of any other insurance policy students may have from their home country (health, travel, life, etc).

Exception – Students with Norwegian, Swedish, or Belgian citizenship and who are covered by a reciprocal health care arrangement from their country are exempt from the OSHC requirement.

BEAM Students are covered with OSHC policy with BUPA combined with a GSI insurance stipulated between the University of Trento- Italy and Expat – Belgium for the period covered by BEAM grant.

Alternatively, students may decide to arrange their own OSHC policy with one of the other OSHC providers approved by the Australian immigration department as listed below. Students who choose to arrange their own OSHC policy must be sure to arrange the necessary type and length of OSHC cover for their entire stay in Australia.

Student Visa

Once the student completes the "respond to offer" process, they will receive an electronic confirmation of enrolment (eCoE). They will then need to submit the eCOE to the Australian Department of Immigration and Border Protection (DIBP) as part of the student visa application http://www.border.gov.au/Trav/Visa-1 Students should select Visas > Non award visa > 575 – Non Award Sector.

BEAM students are exempt from the payment of visa fees, since BEAM project falls in the Encounter scheme of Visa fees waiver, not applicable for on line visa procedure.

○ Exception – eCoE is not issued for exchange students with Australian citizenship or for students traveling on a visa that is not a student visa (ie. Students on a 417 - Working Holiday or 462 – Work and Holiday visa can study for up to four months under this visa.)
